Loving Our Neighbors

Cast: Maggie, a goofy puppet & Pastor, a pastor or teacher

Pastor begins as if it's normal children's time. Maggie is hiding somewhere.

Pastor: One time someone asked Jesus, "What is the most important thing in the whole Bible?"

"The most important thing," Jesus said, "is this: 'Hear, O Israel, the Lord our God, the Lord is one. Love the Lord your God with all your heart and with all your soul and with all your mind and with all your strength. And to Love your neighbor as yourself."

Maggie: (Interrupting) Wait a minute, Wait a minute, wait just one minute. Does that mean I have to get all mushy about my next door neighbors? (really make those emphasised words drip with false sweetness and sarcasm)

Pastor: Oh, hi Maggie. Kids, this is Maggie. No, you don't have to get all mushy for your next door neighbors.

Maggie: Because that's what my sister Tabitha did when she fell in love with ______, she sent him *flowers* and wrote him *letters* and cut out heart shaped cards for *Valentines Day...* She went completely stark raving mad!

Pastor: No, No, No, Maggie, that's a different kind of love, that's romantic love and its different to the kind of love God wants us to show.

Maggie: Well good, cause I think that's gross!... So what kind of love does God want us to show to our neighbors then?

Pastor: I was just about to explain that to the kids. Why don't you help me?!

Maggie: But I don't know anything!

Pastor: Of course you do! We all know how to show love because God made us and God IS love! I'll tell you what, Maggie, you can be my assistant and we can all work it out together. The first part is to love God with all your heart, soul, mind, and strength. What do you think that means?

Maggie: Uh...

Pastor: Well, where's your heart?

Maggie: (points to chest)

Maggie: Ooh! Ooh! I know the next one! Your mind! (points to head) It's what makes you think!

Pastor: That's right! All your thoughts and everything you think to yourself all day long. Very

Maggie: Wow, I never thought of it that way! harharhar

Pastor: Nice one. Now, what's the last way Jesus said we should Love God, with all our...?
